

In September 2005, the Zoskes took their passion for barbecue to the next level, but don't let the name fool you. They do more than barbecue!

The meats are seasoned with Jason's own special rub and are accompanied by two varieties of the Zoskes homemade barbecue sauces.

"We offer all barbecued meats and all of our meats are unsauced," comments Michelle. "We feel that the meat should be good enough to stand on its own and that BBQ sauce should compliment it."

In addition to smoked meats, Zoske's Barbecue offers a variety of home-made sides and bakery fresh buns, or you can create a menu yourself. They provide disposable plates, napkins and silverware for their full service or drop-off service to make it easy on their clients. They also provide a number of their most popular items in bulk, including beef brisket, pulled pork and sliced pork loin. These fully-cooked meats come vacuumed-sealed, by the pound, ready to be warmed up and enjoyed.

"We are working to expand our menu beyond BBQ," said Michelle. "We are more than willing to customize a menu to accomodate any special requests. We have even done breakfasts that included egg bake and homemade cinnamon rolls. And Jason makes pies."

In the past, you may have seen the Zoske Barbecue trailer in various locations during the summer months. However, they will not be setting up the red trailier this summer to devote more attention to their catering business.

"We may not be the least expensive option, but do feel that you get what you pay for," said Michelle. "Try us once and we think you'll be happy. We try to go above and beyond your expectations."



Reserve a booth for the Job Fair



On Wednesday, April 2, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., Job Fair 2008 is coming to Babe Harder Memorial Complex on the Marshalltown Community College Campus, provided free of charge to participants. Every spring coordinators bring together more than 70 area employers and graduate schools from all around Iowa. Anyone who is looking for a new job or researching a future career will be delighted with the opportunities available in one location for the day.

Job Fair 2008 expects to be at maximum capacity again this year with employers and graduate school representatives exhibiting business and hiring information and discussing career and educational opportunities with participants. The Job Fair provides a smorgasbord of potential employers all under one roof and offers many opportunities to improve job-seeking skills. There will also be many tools to make applying for a job much easier.

Computers will be available for participants to complete online applications for the employers represented at the job fair. Many businesses have gone from paper forms to online applications so if this is new to you, there will be assistance available to acquaint you with the process.

Another valuable tool at Job Fair 2008 is the free résumé writing critique table where participants can have résumés reviewed at no charge. Local employers and professionals from Workforce Development who evaluate résumés daily, will staff the table. This is a perfect place to get advice on improving your résumé so it is one that grabs the employer¹s attention. Just bring along a prepared résumé and stop by the critiquing table.

One of the most popular workshops offered each year is the Employer Panel. Several representatives of different career areas will share their company¹s background then answer questions from the audience. If you have a question you¹ve wanted to ask an employer - this is your chance. Job Fair participants always rate this session as one of the most valuable.

There will be tips and advice on many different topics such as the skills employers are looking for, what expectations human resource personnel might have, reminders of appropriate attire and using good manners.

Marshalltown area trivia

Did you know these fun facts about Marshalltown and the surrounding area?

- The Matthew Edel Blacksmith Shop, located in Haverhill, is one of the few original blacksmith shops remaining in the state. The shop appears much as it did in 1940 when owner Matthew Edel died.
- Marshalltown native Jeff Clement holds the National High School Career Record for 75 Home Runs.
- The Art Gallery Addition to the Fisher Community Center was constructed with insurance funds received by the Fisher Governor Foundation as a result of the theft, on March 19, 1987, of a painting ("Les Barques de Peche Devant les Falaises d'Etretat") by French Impressionist Claude Monet.
- The Marshall County Courthouse was designed by the same architect as the state Capitol Building.
- Iowa Valley Adventures Challenge Course in Marshalltown is the only 50-ft Alpine rope tower in the State.
- Since 1977 Iowa artist Patrick Acton of Matchstick Marvels in Gladbrook, has used 3 million matchsticks to build large detailed models, including over 600,000 matchsticks used to create Harry Potter's Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry.

Chamber Membership packet receives facelift



A great resource that Marshall County has right in our own back yard is Iowa State University (ISU). One of the programs they offer is through the Industrial Assessment Center (IAC). This organization provides energy, productivity, and waste assessments for industrial-related companies. The IAC program is one of 26 IACs located nationwide and is funded by the U. S. Department of Energy.

These assessments are provided free of charge for companies who meet at least three of the following criteria: (1) gross annual sales of \$100 million or less; (2) annual energy costs ranging from \$100,000 to \$2.5 million; (3) fewer than 500 employees; (4) no in-house energy expert.

There are two objectives of the IAC program. The first is to provide a free service to manufacturers to identify monetary savings from reduced energy and waste costs and increased revenue from productivity enhancements. The second is to provide an educational opportunity to engineering students through on-site plant visits, data analysis, and technical report writing.

The process itself will include an IAC team reviewing the past 12 months of the facility's utility bills, touring the operation, and collecting energy data. Once this has been done, a detailed report is provided to the facility within two months of the on-site visit.

The facility is under no obligation to implement any of the recommendations presented in the report; however, it is hoped that recommendations made will show sufficient payback to warrant careful consideration by plant management.

IVL 2008 discusses diversity



Iowa Valley Leadership's February session focused on the stories of how and why people have made Marshalltown home. A panel of community members from California, Sudan, Germany, Singapore, Congo, and several areas of Mexico expressed a common sentiment: they want to live here and they feel Marshalltown and its citizens are welcoming and friendly.

Tom Renze, principal of Woodbury, and Dave Beckman, minister at First Presbyterian Church, shared the experiences they've had working with new community members of different cultures. The focus of the session was the diverse cultures of Marshalltown. Lori Chesser, Davis-Brown Law Firm, specializes in immigration issues and shared information on the immigration process and talked about wait times many immigrants face when immigrating to the United States. She explained that family members of US citizens are eligible to immigrate to the U.S. on March 1, 2008, if they filed the proper forms by July 1, 1992, if they are from Mexico; March 1, 1993, if they are from the Philippines; or February 15, 2002, if they are from India.

Class member and Lennox employee, John Ernat, explained Lennox LEAN Manufacturing and arranged a tour of Lennox to start the day, followed by a tour at RACOM with Mike Miller. Miller explained that RACOM is the "911 for 911".

On March 26, IVL will travel to Des Moines as part of the Chamber's annual Des Moines Summit and Legislative Day. Lynn Olberding, Director of Membership and Marketing for the Marshalltown Area Chamber of Commerce, Loras Neuroth of Independent Insurance, and Reed Riskadahl from Flooring Gallery who serves as the chairperson for the Chamber's Local Government committee shared the Chamber's legislative priorities.
