



According to the 2008 Iowa Welcome Center Survey Report, travelers in Iowa spent more money in the state in 2008 versus 2007. Travel party spending per day on lodging, entertainment, transportation, food and shopping increased 15.3 percent from \$223.66 in 2007 to \$257.93 in 2008.

During 2008, 20 Iowa Welcome Centers served nearly 500,000 individuals and over 200,000 travel parties. These travelers spent an estimated \$196 million during their trips in Iowa.

#### **Iowa Tourism Industry Showcase**

Iowa Tourism Supporters hosted the 20th annual Tourism Showcase for Legislators at the Iowa State Fairgrounds on February 3.

More than 70 communities showcased their attractions, events and businesses to remind the 105 Legislators that attended about the abundance of "Things to Do" in our great state.

The Marshalltown Convention & Visitors Bureau and John Ernest Vineyard and Winery hosted a booth together at the showcase. Shannon Espenscheid, MCVB Director, Shauna Banks, MCVB Assistant and Jamie Busch-Upah, John Ernest Vineyard and Winery were among other tourism leaders who visited with Legislators to thank them for their past support of tourism development and promotion and to discuss the challenge of finding funds to promote Iowa.

"The economic impact of tourism expenditures in Iowa continues to grow at a pace faster than the rest of the nation," said Kathy Dirks, Presi-

dent of the Travel Federation of Iowa. According to an economic impact study completed by the Travel Industry Association of America, Iowa tourism generated expenditures grew 7.6 percent in 2007, outpacing the national average of 5.7 percent.

In 2007, travelers in Iowa generated \$6.3 billion in spending at local businesses in communities throughout the state. These dollars in turn, generated \$307.7 million in state tax receipts for Iowa.

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#### **Unemployment data and services**

According to Iowa Workforce Development, Marshalltown's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose to 7.5% in December from 6.4% in November. This was substantially higher than the 5.5% rate in December a year ago. Marshall County's unemployment rate rose from 5.8% in November to 6.8% in December. This is 1.2% higher than last year's December rate. Iowa's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate edged up to 4.6% in December from the 4.3% in November. This is significantly higher than the 3.8% one year ago.

Nationwide, joblessness is now rising and increasing number of people are finding themselves in an unfamiliar position: unemployed. Help for those that have been left behind can be found at Iowa Workforce Development Centers. From unemployment benefits to job search workshops to resource centers, Iowa Workforce Development offices are there to help.
