Growth: Bratney Companies Chooses Marshalltown Gateway Centre Site

Bratney Companies expects to begin construction this spring on a new fabrication facility located in the Marshalltown Gateway Centre. The site, a six-acre lot, located west of Marshalltown, was approved for sale by Consumers Energy's Board of Directors.

Based in Urbandale, Iowa, Bratney Companies provides equipment, design and con-



struction services to the seed, grain, feed, and raw food industries. A significant part of these offerings includes various sheet and structural steel fabricated parts, assemblies, and pieces of equipment. Bratney plans to produce these important components in the new 12,000-square-foot fabrication facility which will create between 7 and 10 manufacturing jobs.

"This is an important strategic step for Bratney, and a major milestone for our company," said Peter Bratney, President and CEO of Bratney Companies. "This fabrication facility will allow us to ensure the optimal quality and delivery of fabricated components to our customers' projects throughout the United States. The Marshalltown Gateway Centre was a natural choice for the facility. The Marshalltown community has a great labor pool from which to draw talented craftsmen, and the location of the Gateway Centre is ideal from a transportation and logistics standpoint."

Instrumental in bringing Bratney Companies and Consumers Energy together was Bruce Nuzum of the Iowa Area Development Group (IADG) and Tom Deimerly of Marshall Economic Development Impact Committee (MEDIC). A deciding factor in Bratney Companies choosing the Marshalltown site was the ability to use revolving loan funds from Consumers Energy and Central Iowa Power Cooperative (CIPCO), Consumers Energy's wholesale power supplier, to help fund a portion of the new facility at a favorable interest rate. These funds are made available through USDA Rural Development.

"This is a significant project for Bratney Companies and Consumers Energy. This is a great opportunity to help spur economic development in the Marshalltown area and surrounding communities," said Jim Kidd, General Manager of Consumers Energy.
