Orpheum Theater Center brings The Music Man to Marshalltown

The Orpheum Theater Center welcomes two guest artists to direct the inaugural production of the Orpheum Performance Series. The Prairie Series theme will open with Meredith Wilson's *The Music Man* being produced at the Orpheum Black Box Theater.

Directing the production is Rod Caspers, a native of Cedar Rapids who recently returned to Iowa. The Musical Director/Composer, is Dr. Rebecca Burhardt, a native of Texas and current University of Northern Iowa Director of Orchestral Activities, Music Director of the Northern Iowa Symphony Orchestra, and Music Director for the University of Northern Iowa Opera Theatre.

Caspers and Burhardt join Pip Gordon, Director of the Orpheum, who serves as the resident lighting and set designer for the Orpheum Center, and Chris Winnemann, the Orpheum Theater Center Technical Director.

Rod Caspers has been the Executive Director of Creative Services for the University of Texas System for five years where he and his colleagues recently received Lone Star Emmy Awards for the PBS series, State of Tomorrow. He has directed more than 100 productions, receiving numerous awards.

Most recently Rod directed Slammer for New York's Fringe Festival, Assassins for the University of Texas, The Bat, Austin Lyric Opera's new adaptation of Die Fledermaus and the Music Man for Zilker Theatre Productions. For the past two seasons he has stage-managed the Radio City Christmas Spectacular Arena Tour starring the Rockettes. Rod is a proud alumnus of the Madison Scouts Drum and Bugle Corps. He has a B.A., Illinois State University, 1976; and an M.F.A., The University of Texas at Austin, 1984.

Rebecca Burkhardt, Ph.D. has been at the University of Northern Iowa since 1988. She earned a bachelor of music degree from Southwestern University (TX), a master of music education from the University of North Texas, and her Ph. D. at the University of Texas, Austin. Dr. Burkhardt has an interest to develop new work and has written a musical, A Scotch Verdict, in collaboration with UNI theatre professor Cynthia Goatley. She has collaborated with Caspers and Gordon on several productions and is eager to work together again on such a dynamic program.

Dr. Burkhardt recently composed, "Fanfare For The First Lady" for Michele Obama and she led the UNI orchestra during Mrs. Obama's visit to Cedar Falls as the UNI commencement speaker. The music was featured on national ABC news. The very next day Dr. Burkhardt was in the Orpheum Black Box Theatre teaching The Music Man cast to sing, "Iowa Stubborn".

The Orpheum Performance Series received a major grant from the Martha-Ellen Tye Foundation that made it possible to begin the performance program this spring. The Music Man is the first of four plays in The Prairie Series that will celebrate all things Iowa during the first year of the program. Tryouts were held at the end of April and rehearsals are happening six days a week. Thirty-seven people auditioned and 24 actors were cast from Marshalltown, State Center, Grinnell, LeGrand, Tama, and Cedar Falls. Musicians for the production are from Marshalltown, Ames, Cedar Falls, and Waterloo. Several Orpheum Interns are assisting with The Music Man production and they are earning college credit from the University of Northern Iowa, Viterbo University in Wisconsin, and Iowa State University.

The Music Man production dates include the opening night on June 10 and performances on June 11, 12, 16, 17, 18, and 19. The inaugural show will be presented in the round with only 100 seats available per performance. To reserve your tickets by credit card, call 641-844-5919.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Jobs being created, but at a sluggish pace

Through the first quarter of 2011 the pace of job creation in the US accelerated, spread out over a range of sectors. While health care continued to lead the way with job growth, other sectors have shown progress recently. During the recent recession health care services such as physical and occupational therapy, nursing, speech pathology, radiation technology and cardiology technology added about 500,000 jobs while the rest of the economy shed over 8 million. And health care services promise to grow with an aging population.

The first quarter also saw job growth in financial services. Accountants, bookkeepers and managers are finding employment. Business and professional services are hiring consultants, lawyers, executive secretaries, office managers and other administrative support personnel. Sales and marketing positions are also seeing hiring occur. Restaurants and other service sector occupations are seeing hiring increases.

After numerous quarters of job loss, manufacturing is finally beginning to hire. Some plants are adding back shifts that were curtailed during the recession. Some manufacturing managers are finding it difficult to find experienced machinists and engineers.

While job growth is occurring, overall it is happening at a slow rate as employers continue to hold down costs and wring more production from the existing workforce. As an example, manufacturing production is up 12% since hitting the bottom of the recession, but hiring is only up 2%. Construction jobs will continue to lag for many years. Only 36,000 jobs have been added since January and two million have been lost since the recession began.

Not only has job creation been sluggish, but wage hikes are smaller. Wage hikes are expected to match inflation at 2.5% this year. Without larger pay checks, consumer spending will remain lower than desired for continued recovery.

Currently there are about 13.5 million people unemployed, with about 30% of them without a job for over a year. Of this number about 2.5 million, while able to work, have given up trying to find a job for at least the past month. When you add an additional 8.4 million people who are working part time but would like full time work, the picture is somewhat bleak.

Legislative Priorities Report

State Government Budget and Finances

We support a reduction in state spending of at least 15% as was suggested by Governor Branstad as an important step in getting the State's fiscal house in order. Status: The Legislature has not adjourned well past its 110 day session due to a fiscal battle over budget levels. The actual spending reductions are yet to be determined as the Legislature and Governor continue to negotiate the final state budget amount.

Research Activities Tax Credit

We support the continuance of this tax credit as an important economic development incentive. Status: The tax credit was continued. Additional important tax credit programs that were renewed include the historic tax credit and the endow Iowa tax credit program.

Business Climate

We support keeping Iowa's Right to Work status, and we opposed open-scope bargaining, employee choice of doctor, prevailing wage and increased health insurance mandates. Status: None of these various antibusiness proposals came before the legislature this session.

Property Tax

We support a reduction in commercial/industrial property tax. Status: The Senate passed one version of commercial property tax reduction targeted at small business, and the House passed a different more comprehensive commercial/industrial property tax reduction plan. At this point how a compromise of these two plans will look is not clear. The outcome of getting commercial/industrial property tax reduced is part of the overall budget negotiations.

Transportation

We support making sure revenues intended for road/highway infrastructure goes to its intended purpose, and we support increasing revenue to meet the increased cost of maintaining and building our highway system. Status: No legislation was considered during this session however, the Governor has appointed a special transportation committee to work during interim to develop a transportation plan with funding recommendations prior to the 2012 session.

Economic Development

We support the restructuring of the Iowa Department of Economic Development to a public/private partnership. Status: Restructuring legislation has been approved by the House and is pending in the Senate. It's fate has become part of the overall budget negotiations.

Education

We support an assortment of proposals that would improve Iowa's education system. Status: Funding levels for pre-school and community colleges, and allowable growth levels for K-12 are part of the overall budget negotiations. There were very few other education policy issues considered during this session. The Governor is sponsoring a high-level education summit in July. If any significant policy proposals come from this summit, then there is a chance that he will call a special session of the Legislature to enact those proposals.
