## Business recovery resources available

We are saddened by the devastation of the July 19 storm that ripped through the north central part of Marshalltown. Recovering businesses have a number of resources from which to draw. Chamber Executive Director, Lynn Olberding, says, "We want our Chamber member businesses to know that we are here for them and for the community." The Chamber has been helping coordinate a number of recovery efforts.

Additionally, since the day following the storm, the Small Business Development Center (SBDC) has been on site at Fisher Community Center offering assistance.

# Disaster Recovery Services available from SBDC

- Locating assistance for clean-up
- Locating temporary workspace, if needed
- Understanding options for assistance (including state aid)
- Discussing options for business recovery and/or reopening
- Connecting businesses with contractors
- Locating and applying for financing (if necessary)



Duane Johnson, SBDC representative, said "In this instance, we will sit down, find out needs, brainstorm options, and help connect businesses to service providers. That may include such activities such as discussing finances, finding a contractor, locating temporary operating space, or the like."

One of the tools SBDC offers is a **Business Assessment Check-list**. Business owners can use this to make certain they are covering

the multiple aspects of damage as-

sessment, identifying preliminary action, and ultimately creating a plan of action.

A premier retirement community for active seniors, The Embers offers care-free, affordable retirement living in a "family" environment. Director Vicki Bogner and her 19 staff members are dedicated to satisfying residents' needs and requests. They also celebrate a rich history.

"We provide a safe and happy environment for residents," says Bogner. "When I sit down with seniors to talk about living here, they are surprised

about how affordable living at The Embers really is. And, watching residents have fun with activities, enjoy their new "family," and stay active in their community is great. Plus,

> the comradery that residents and staff provide each other really makes this a 'Family Affair.'"

The 108 apartments offering 1-

visit to the GrimesFarm (right). and 2-bedroom or studio floor plans (each with a kitchen), was birthed on

the site of the abandoned St. Thomas Mercy Hospital. "The hospital cornerstone, laid in 1902, is displayed in the front of our building," Bogner shares. "Even our kitchen floor is original, dating back to hospital days."


The need for housing healthy seniors was the impetus leading to construction of Friendwhip West in 1987. "The idea was to provide a life-care facility for seniors in Marshalltown," explains Bogner. In 1991, after financial difficulties and the forced sale of Friendship West, new ownership changed the name to The Embers with the slogan, "A New Beginning." Seniors could now live independently on a month-to-month rental basis.

"Our low rent includes two restaurant-style meals a day, twice monthly housekeeping, maintenance, transportation (medical and shopping), all

utilities, 24-hour staffing, activities, a safe and secure environment, and a host of amenities," Bogner explains. "One resident calls The Embers 'heaven on earth!' We invite potential residents to enjoy the freedom we offer."

# Rebuilding Marshalltown By Tom Deimerly, Executive Director, Marshall Economic Development



## 34th annual Mid-Iowa Antique Power Show

The Marshalltown Convention & Visitors Bureau extends a hearty welcome and thank you to the Mid-Io-wa Antique Power Association for the show that will take place at 2372 Jessup Avenue, Marshalltown, on August 3-5. The event is dedicated to preserving farming as it was done in Iowa and the Midwest in the early 1900s. It brings in upwards of 2,000 participants of all ages from across the country. That translates into a large economic impact for our community.
