Top 10 favorite spots on the Linn Creek Recreational Trail

Some call it a bike trail, but I've been known to bike, hike, jog and chase my kids on the Linn Creek Recreational Trail, one of my favorite things about Marshalltown.

Here are my top 10 places on the trail, which spans the northeastern edge of Marshalltown to the west side.

- 1. Hello Iowa River: Though much of the trail runs alongside Linn Creek (hence the name), the trail also runs near the Iowa River at Riverview Park. It's a great view and a great start or finish to your ride.
- 2. Reaching Grimes Farm: With its trails, playscape, conservation center and more, making a stop at Grimes Farm is always welcome, even if it's just for a drink of water.
- 3. Da Woods! You can go from winding through the softball and little league fields in town to be smack dab in the woods in a matter of seconds. And right when you hit the start of the tree cover there's a nice downhill that gets you going so fast you'll think you've entered the bat cave.
- 4. Under the Bridge: Speaking of getting close to the water, there is a railroad bridge you go under as you near Lennox. It's usually a nice place to hear flowing water or the trains above.
- 5. Deer Alley: There's a pretty good chance to see deer in the thick of the wooded area halfway between Judge Park and Grimes Farm. These deer tend not to scatter as much as you would think as they seem used to people trucking by. So have a stare down with one of them and enjoy the view.
- 6. Covered Bridge. This bridge is scenic and is just a cool thing to cross over Linn Creek.
- 7. Bridge over Linn Creek by Grimes Farm: Might not want to take this one too fast in either direction as sharp turns await, so slow down and enjoy the view.
- 8. Mega-10 Break: Check out the activity at Mega-10 and the skate park as you ride by with the wind in your hair. Also take the extra loop to see the activity at the aquatic center.
- 9. Softball Action: If you go by the adult softball fields slow enough you

can see if that person can leg out that infield single without pulling a hammy.

10. The Great Wide Open. There is a spot in between Riverview Park and Lennox where your legs will get challenged on a windy day. No wind break on either side so buckle up and feel the burn.

Mark Mauk, Guiding Star of Marshalltown Board Chair, says "the world of women's healthcare does not currently provide natural, holistic, prolife or pro-family care and women need alternatives. Guiding Star Marshalltown provides women with a holistic option for women's healthcare. We provide services in the areas of fertility care, doula support, lactation support, and drop-in child-watch for women/families visiting our center. Our fertility care professional is a registered nurse certified in the Creighton Model FertilityCareTM System. We offer certified doulas services (for pregnancy support) and certified lactation services. We work with those in the community, especially young people, churches and business owners, who share the Guiding Star mission of following scientifically proven holistic health care for women."

2020 Census is important for our community

The census provides critical data that lawmakers, business owners, teachers, and many others use to provide daily services, products, and support for you and your community. Every year, billions of dollars in federal funding go to hospitals, fire departments, schools, roads, and other resources based on census data.

Census 2020

The results of the census also determine the number of seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives, and they are used to draw congressional and state legislative districts.

It's also in the Constitution: Article 1, Section 2, mandates that the country conduct a count of its population once every 10 years. The 2020 Census will mark the 24th time that the country has counted its population since 1790.

Participating in the census is required by law, even if you recently completed another survey from the Census Bureau. A complete and accurate count is critical for you and your community, because the results of the 2020 Census will affect community funding, congressional representation, and more.

Census Timeline 2020

- January 21: The U.S. Census Bureau started counting the population in remote Alaska. The count officially began in the rural Alaskan village of Toksook Bay.
- March 12 20: Households began receiving official Census Bureau mail with detailed information on how to respond to the 2020 Census online, by phone, or by mail.
- •March 30 April 1: The Census Bureau will count people who are experiencing homelessness over these three days. As part of this process, the Census Bureau counts people in shelters, at soup kitchens and mobile food vans, on the streets, and at non-sheltered, outdoor locations such as tent encampments.
- •April 1: Census Day is observed nationwide. When you respond to the census, you'll tell the Census Bureau where you live as of April 1, 2020.

•April: Census takers will begin visiting college students who live on campus, people living in senior centers, and others who live among large groups of people

Youth YMCA state swim championships held
