Membership Hack: Networking during COVID

Here are some great tips to help any business person network more efficiently during COVID-19.

1. Patience is Key: Everyone's lives have been upended (personally and professionally) by COVID-19, so expecting people to get back to you timelymaybe unrealistic. When contacting potential clients, give them a week to respond. If you still haven't heard back after a week, reach back out.

2. Build the Relationship: Make a list of those within your network and think of ways you can help them. It doesn't have to be big, even just sending a potential client a link to an article that might affect their business is enough. Being sincere is what counts. Remember, for \$30, the Marshalltown Chamber will print you mailing labels of all chamber members. This is a great way to reach out. Or hop on www.marshalltown.org and search under business directories to get addresses and phone numbers and make contact.

3. In-Video instead of In-Person: Yes, in-video can be personable and is probably more realistic than in-person. Set up a 15-minute video chat so potential clients can see your face and your expressions. This makes your time more authentic and meaningful. Be sure to test all your technology before getting online to make sure it's successful.

4. Attend as many events as you can (or feel comfortable with) - virtual or in-person: Because many of this year's events are canceled or postponed, it is vital to make a strong effort to attend whatever events you can. Obviously, a cancellation in events mean that your networking opportunities are limited, so take advantage of whatever networking opportunities are available. The Marshalltown Area Chamber of Commerce will be providing events this year that you can participate in. Check our online calendar and read your e-newsletters for more information.

Increase web presence by making sure your website is updated. You can also add a sign-up form to collect emails. Incentivize potential customers to sign up by offering discounts and newsletters. Look to connect with customers through social media and be sure to have links

back to your website on all platforms. Some small businesses like, Lefty's Live Music, are still conducting business through social media platforms. They are both delivering cocktails and streaming their concerts through their Facebook page.

Send updates via email to your customers. Make sure your email list is clean and current. Some examples of updates to include are: store hour changes; event cancellations or postponements; how customers can access and support your business virtually; and new business procedures (i.e. de-

livery, pickup, appointments). Offer customized email depending on type of customer (i.e. regular patron, referrals, targeted new customers).

Communicate workplace safety to educate your customers. Make sure to let them know about your in-store store cleaning protocols, social distancing requirements, order fulfillment options such as curbside pick-up, provision of hand sanitizer or other disinfectant in appropriate areas, and efforts to protect vulnerable customers. Grocery stores are communicating with their customers on all the efforts to keep their stores clean and safe including having special hours of shopping for seniors.

Workforce considerations to keeping your dedicated employees. Consider reducing your hours of operation to reduce the hours of work. Also, consider furloughs instead of layoffs. While layoffs terminate employment and your relationship with your employees, furloughs allow you to keep them on your payroll but on unpaid leave of absence.
