### Important Census deadline is September 30

A key deadline of September 30 is approaching for the 2020 U.S. Census. This is the deadline to complete your Census, which can be done online at my2020census.gov, via phone or via mail. It's not too late!

Census takers have been following up with in-person visits across the country for those who have not completed the forms. The 2020 Census counts every person living in the United States and the five U.S. territories.

#### Why is the Census important?

The results of the 2020 Census will help determine how hundreds of billions of dollars in federal funding flow into communities every year for the next decade. That funding shapes many different aspects of every community, no matter the size, no matter the location. The Census determines how many congressional representatives each state gets.


Census results affect planning and funding for infrastructure—including programs for highway planning and construction, Section 8 housing, federal transit, community development, and rural water and waste disposal systems.

#### A message from the Marshall County Board of Health

We are currently in the midst of a pandemic with COVID-19 and now the annual flu season is starting. Many people and many employers have questions about these two illnesses. Both are caused by viruses and both are primarily spread through respiratory means.

The flu and COVID-19 share many symptoms: fever, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle aches, sore throat, runny nose, or headache. Both illnesses can be very mild or each can become very severe and lead to complications or death. COVID-19 has a symptom that the flu does not have and that is a change in or loss of taste or smell.

If you are ill you need to stay home. You should consider being tested for COVID-19 if you have had exposure to a case of COVID-19 or if you experience a loss of taste or smell. If you have more severe symptoms you should see your provider and they can test for both COVID-19 and influenza. It is important to differentiate between COVID-19 and influenza so that we can try to reduce the spread of these viruses.

If you have COVID-19 you should stay home for at least 10 days since the onset of symptoms assuming you are without a fever for the last day. If you have influenza you should stay home until you are without fever for 24 hours.

Everyone should receive a flu shot this fall. As has been reported in the news work is being done on developing a vaccine for COVID-19 and hopefully that will be available in the near future. At this time we do not know what the vaccine will entail and further details should be forthcoming.

### Two Marshalltown Businesses are chosen for the Goldman Sach's 10,000 Small Businesses Program

the 10,000 Small Businesses program. To qualify, participants have to be in business for at least two years, have business revenues of \$100,000 in the most recent fiscal year, have at least two full-time employees, and be the owner or co-owner of said business. The program is funded through the Goldman Sachs Foundation, in partnership with Babson, ICIC, and DMACC and all tuition and costs (including meals and hotel during in-person stays) are covered for the business owner.



Tasha owns the salon with husband, Terry Schnathorst, who is also a full-time employee at Marshalltown Company. Schnathorst says "It is an honor just to have been nominated, and then selected as just 1 of 27 businesses in the state of Iowa! As someone whose motto is – Never stop learning – I am excited to learn from leaders in the business industry. Over the past few years, I have been slowly backing out of the treatment room, to focus more on

business operations. While this program is definitely a time commitment, I am really looking forward to applying everything we learn directly to our business."



Johnathan Bizios co-owns MinuteMan Inc. which provides printing and silkscreen services. Bizios says "Ever since I can remember, I have wanted to own my own business. Growing up, my father owned and ran a restaurant and this sparked an entrepreneurial spirit within me. Starting a new business, I knew that some things were going to be easy and that some things were going to be difficult, just due to lack of experience in some areas. I am hoping that this program will help me gain more experience in various business-related areas as well as provide a network of other business owners that I can communicate with regularly and lean on for advice in certain instances."

The 10,000 Small Businesses program is offered nationwide and according to the website is "an investment to help small businesses grow and create jobs by providing them

with greater access to education, capital, and business support services." Business owners from across the state of Iowa will commit 6 hours/week (either online or in-person) for a full semester and will focus on topics such as leadership skills, negotiation tactics, and being competitive in our current business climate. They will also be building a network of support through other business owners in the program.



# ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

### The state of the U.S. economy

During the years preceding 2020's first fiscal quarter, the American economy experienced significant growth and expansion. GDP had achieved strong figures in 2018, and the economy continued to expand in 2019. Unemployment rates for January and February in 2020 were 3.6% and 3.5% respectively; these are exceptional figures given that 4 to 5% unemployment is generally regarded by economists as full employment. At the end of 2020's first fiscal quarter, COVID-19 resulted in an artificial shutdown of commerce and industry across the country. At the same time, the Federal Reserve's Open Market Committee (FOMC) lowered the federal funds rate to 0 to 0.25%. This change decreased the borrowing rate for many consumer products like credit cards and personal loans. Additionally, the CARES Act served as a buffer during the harshest months of the pandemic when non-essential services were shutdown.

As we prepare to enter the fourth fiscal quarter for 2020, the economic landscape ahead is looking hopeful. The unemployment rate for August came in at 8.4%, down from 10.2% in July and 14.4% in April - the highest unemployment rate for 2020 during COVID-19. Even though 8.4% is still a bit high, the trend is on track to deliver more employment and better GDP numbers for 2020's last quarter. The Federal Reserve has also signaled rates would remain for a while in order to help our country recover. The American people have proven time and again that we can defeat anything that comes our way, and this situation is no different.


