## MEMBER SPOTLIGHT



The Animal Rescue League of Marshalltown has been a prominent fixture in the community since its inception in 1948. The need for an animal shelter arose in 1947, when a special committee was formed at the request of the city council to address the numerous dogs running

at large in the city of Marshalltown. At the time, the city pound consisted of a wire enclosure at the city dump. As concerned citizens joined the committee, they presented a solution; to form a private, non-profit corporation that could adequately shelter and care for cats, dogs, and other domesticated animals.

Today, the Animal Rescue League sees over 1,000 pets a year. Some of those are lost and quickly reunited with their family members while others start a new chapter with their adoptive forever family. They see lost and found pets daily, but there are other services the ARL offers that many are unaware of, such as live trap rentals, cremation and burial services, memorial bricks, and kennel sponsorships. There are also many opportunities for volunteering that allow people to give back to their community.

Volunteers are amazing, because there's such a wide variety of people with varying skills that can all help in different ways. Some volunteers are young kids, learning about the responsibilities of caring for a pet, others are daily volunteers who walk dogs or clean kennels, and others belong to groups within the community that want to give back to the ARL.

The Animal Rescue League feels lucky to be a part of this community. There are so many kind, caring, and compassionate people who are awe-some pet owners and do a lot to help the ARL succeed. If they put a plea out to help with kitten food or dog toys, there is always an overwhelming response. When they go to events around town, they are met with kindness. When new visitors come, their animals feel loved and supported. But, the absolute best part of the Animal Rescue League is seeing families made whole by the newest addition of a four-legged family member.

For anyone wanting to learn more, the Animal Rescue League is a great place to visit. ## Annual Breast Cancer Awareness Luncheon going virtual and moving to October 21

UnityPoint Health – Marshalltown Foundation has announced that its annual Breast Cancer Awareness Luncheon is going virtual and moving back two weeks to Thursday, October 21, 2021.

Registered participants will join the event online between noon and 1 p.m. to hear a presentation by featured speaker Julie Bousum. In addition, those registered will have a dessert hand-delivered to their location and may participate in a silent auction.

Proceeds from the luncheon go toward the Prevent Fund, which was established in 1998 to provide free mammograms for qualifying men and women in the community. The funds help women and men who qualify fill in the gaps of coverage when they have no insurance or a prohibitively high deductible.

"When a provider has recommended a mammogram, it's critical that people get screenings when they're due," said Shari King, administrator of the UnityPoint Health hospital in Marshalltown. "We know early detection can make a huge difference in a person's treatment and survival rate. Unfortunately, due to financial reasons, many people delay their mammograms, and we hope this event will help raise their awareness and help minimize that that risk."

The UnityPoint Health Mammography team is consistently recognized for its outstanding patient care and ranks among the top 1% for patient satisfaction in national surveys.

## Marshalltown positioned well for growth in the next decade

According to the population numbers recently reported by the U.S. Census Bureau, Marshalltown kept pace with similar-sized communities in Iowa. Between 2010 and 2020 Marshalltown showed a slight growth from 27,552 to 27,591 or an increase in population of 0.1%.

"Given what has transpired in this community over the last several years with two significant natural disasters, you would expect to see a sharp decline in population as a result," said John Hall, President & CEO of the Marshalltown Area Chamber of Commerce. "The results we received of effectively holding steady came as a welcome surprise and means we are incredibly well positioned to bounce back from those disasters and grow from there."

In comparison to other cities of similar size in the state, Marshalltown, Muscatine and Ottumwa saw growth while Fort Dodge, Mason City, Burlington and Clinton saw a population decline.

Marshall County as a whole did see a decline of 1.3 percent in population.

"We will continue to work with our partners in other area towns to help with the growth of the county," Hall said. "It's no secret that the Marshalltown Area Chamber of Commerce has ambitious growth plans for Marshalltown and Marshall County and it's going to take growth in all corners of the county in order to make that happen."
