Iowa SBDC addresses Cybersecurity

Greetings Marshalltown Chamber members! Let's talk about cybersecurity.

Cybersecurity is an important topic for small business owners to learn about and embrace, even when we are convinced that our digital presence is negligible, and cannot even fathom who would want to take the time to disrupt our "small town Iowa" small business. True, our businesses may not be on the radar of international hackers. Our businesses may, however, be on the radar of a disgruntled employee, dissatisfied client, or the kid down the block, who is honing hacking skills for fun. We may, also shy away from the topic because it is "one more thing," in an already overflowing day, week or month. Fortunately, there are resources available to simplify the learning, increase our knowledge about cybersecurity and provide us with some steps for action.

First, let's explore some ways that cyber attacks regularly impact small businesses. For instance, phishing emails can bait unaware business owners and employees to disclose information or respond to requests that are illegitimate. Or, we may unknowingly click on a link that looks official, only to discover that the link unleashed a ransomware attack on our system, and has locked us out until payment has been made.

Once we have determined that cyber risk is real, now what do we do? The National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) has created a website dedicated to small business cybersecurity issues (nist.gov/itl/ smallbusinesscyber). NIST has even developed a quick start guide which provides a clear path for small businesses owners who are ready to implement some cybersecurity measures. Iowa SBDC, also, offers a series of on-demand cybersecurity webinars online at iowasbdc.org.

One final thought...make a date with your insurance agent and learn about the cybersecurity coverage that your business insurance policy may or may not offer. The information may be helpful as you explore what a cybersecurity plan for your business should look like.
