She's spent her time on the job so far traveling the county, getting to know local officials and the general public. "We talk about goals. It's based on what the communities want and who they want me to visit, or if they have ideas," she noted.




Place now hosts 50 assisted living apartments, a cozy memory care, independent living apartments and spacious townhomes. With the rise of residents, they have 40 employees.

UnityPoint Health – Marshalltown Foundation Humbly Accepts Final MCMS Gift for Education, Upgrades

For all intents and purposes, the Marshall County Medical Society (MCMS) disbanded several years ago, but it seems the outgoing organization had one large, final contribution to make to the future of local health care.

Existing members of the MCMS have decided to donate the remaining funds, which total \$37,000, to the UnityPoint Health – Marshalltown Foundation to help with ongoing education.

The hospital is using about \$4,000 of the donation to upgrade its high-fidelity simulation manikin. The remainder of the money will be used to establish and fund an Educational Unity Grant program.


